This course provides students an opportunity to learn about business in China by observing it in practice. Students will travel to China to visit a variety of companies and meet with their managers to learn about the unique opportunities and challenges faced by companies operating in China. Company visits will be selected to include both manufacturing and services firms and to reflect a variety of ownership structures (foreign subsidiaries, locally-owned companies, joint-ventures, etc.). Lectures from faculty at a Chinese host institution will provide specific information on the local business environment and cultural, historical and institutional context. Prerequisite: IBUS 701 or IBUS 820 and IBUS 720. (Please note: This course involves travel abroad and required PRIOR completion of both IBUS 701 and IBUS 720.) Enrollment restricted.
